OSU PARKING PERMITS

Parking permits are required year-round on the OSU Corvallis campus. Sales begin in the fall.

Sign up for parking permit sales notifications online at transportation.oregonstate.edu/START

Know your plate! Your license plate is your permit, and grants you access to an entire zone, not just a particular lot.

Campus Resident Parking

Campus residents are only eligible for Residential (R) permits. R Permits allow access to all R lots. Residential permits can sell out, so secure a permit before bringing a vehicle to campus.

Living Off Campus?

Students living off-campus are eligible for commuter A, B, or C permits.

Visitor Parking

Move-in Day

The Corvallis Fire Department gives special permission to allow temporary loading/unloading in fire lanes during move in day. Parking in fire lanes or yellow curbs is not permitted the rest of the year, so please obey all posted signs and painted curbs during future visits!

Hourly/Daily Permits

Visitors can park in A, B, or C zones with an hourly or daily permit, for sale at kiosks or online at parking.oregonstate.edu. Permits are required 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday - Friday, year-round, even when classes are not in session.

Metered Parking

Metered parking is available on campus 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday-Friday. Don't have coins? Pay with the Passport app. Look for directions on the meter head.

Wheels When You Want Them

Zipcar is a carsharing service for members age 18 and up. Cars are parked on campus near residence halls. Reserve on the fly with the Zipcar app, then use a card to unlock the car and away you go!
